✓ HB47 - EDMONSTON	Sent to Gov.	Requires that communication issued to students or parents about immunization requirements include exemption information.	S
✓ HB56 - NEWELL	Bill Failed	Abortion exceptions which weaken our prolife laws.	O
✓ HB63 - NEWELL	Bill Failed	Abortion exceptions.	O
✓ HB71 - HORTON	Sent to Gov.	Ten Commandments posted in every public school classroom.	S
✓ HB98 - M LANDRY	Bill Failed	Reverses Louisiana Defense of Marriage amendment declaring marriage is between one man and one woman. Creates public policy to recognize marriages between two persons of the same sex.	O
✓ HB114 - FARNUM	Sent to Gov.	Election Integrity in the voter rolls.	S
✓ HB121 - CREWS	Sent to Gov.	Given Name Act: provides for corrective action if school personnel use incorrect names and pronouns.	S
✓ HB122 - HORTON	Sent to Gov.	Prohibits public school teachers and administrators from discussing sexual orientation and gender identity outside of approved curriculum.	S
✓ HB123 - SCHLEGEL	Signed by Gov. - Act 16	Children must have parental permission to create an online account with an internet platform.	S
✓ HB164 - BOYD	Bill Failed	Rape and incest exceptions for abortion.	O
✓ HB234 - BOYD	Bill Failed	Sexual orientation and gender identity protected in employment.	O
✓ HB238 - ECHOLS	Signed by Gov. - Act 420	Restricts foreign adversaries from owning or acquiring agricultural land in Louisiana.	S
✓ HB245 - FREEMAN	Bill Failed	Constitutional amendment legalizing abortion up until birth and requiring tax-payer funding of abortion.	O
✓ HB293 - FREEMAN	Bill Failed	Changes the definition of abortion. Adds specific intent	O
✓ HB395 - BOYD	Bill Failed	Pro-abortion bill creating right to contraception, including abortifacient drugs and devices.	O
✓ HB577 - CARVER	Sent to Gov.	Prohibits social media companies from collecting data to use for targeted advertising to minors.	S
✓ HB581 - THOMAS	Sent to Gov.	Prevents ballot harvesting. Provides requirements and restrictions on the ability to witness election documents.	S
✓ HB608 - WILDER	Signed by Gov. - Act 436	Women's Safety and Protection Act - Truth in biological identity.	S
✓ HB630 - M LANDRY	Bill Failed	Provides for immunity from criminal prosecution for pregnant women who experience abortion. Under current law, this bill is unnecessary.	O
✓ HB644 - DICKERSON	Sent to Gov.	Provides that students enrolled in home study programs may try out for and participate in public school activities, including but not limited to extracurricular activities and interscholastic athletics.	S
✓ HB649 - NEWELL	Bill Failed	Ballot initiative for the decriminalization of recreational marijuana.	O
✓ HB707 - JORDAN	Bill Failed	Decriminalization of recreational marijuana.	O
✓ HB763 - BEAULLIEU	Sent to Gov.	Prohibits federal interference in Louisiana elections.	S
✓ HB833 - DAVIS	Bill Failed	Limits criminal and civil liability of fertility clinics without assurances of protections for human embryos.	O
✓ HB848 - JACKSON	Sent to Gov.	Parish councils and police juries given more budgetary and financial oversight of libraries systems; can amend budgets.	S
✓ HB908 - AMEDEE	Signed by Gov. - Act 460	Prohibits discrimination against students on the basis of vaccination status.	S
✗ HB952 - D MILLER	Sent to Gov.	Codifies and then regulates consummable hemp products containing THC. (Efforts to prohibit THC hemp products were defeated - SB237).	O
✓ HB974 - CARLSON	Sent to Gov.	Permits individuals without a masters degree in library science to be appointed library director. As amended, also gives governing authorities greater control over library boards.	S
✓ HB976 - C OWEN	Sent to Gov.	Requires healthcare facilities to allow in person visitation for patients and residents.	S
✓ HB978 - NEWELL	Bill Failed	Provides for the retail sale of cannabis and cannabis products.	O

✓ SB98 - MCMATH	Bill Failed	Prohibits use of a handheld wireless telecommunications device by a person when operating a motor vehicle upon any public roadway in this state.	O
✓ SB101 - MIGUEZ	Signed by Gov. - Act 291	No ranked choice voting in Louisiana.	S
✓ SB107 - MIZELL	Sent to Gov.	Creates the crime of possessing, trafficking, or importing sexualized paraphernalia which looks like children.	S
✓ SB123 - ABRAHAM	Signed by Gov.- Act 293	With HB 334 by Rep. Amedee, authorizes chaplains to serve in public schools to provide support services.	S
✓ SB133 - PRESSLY	Signed by Gov. - Act 395	The World Health Organization, United Nations, and the World Economic Forum shall have no jurisdiction or power within the state of Louisiana.	S
✓ SB150 - DUPLESSIS	Bill Failed	Along with SB 283, decriminalizes crime against nature solicitation.	O
✓ SB155 - KLEINPETER	Signed by Gov. - Act 302	Election integrity - prevents ballot harvesting.	S
✓ SB194 - MIGUEZ	Signed by Gov. - Act 59	Local governments cannot restrict the possession of firearms beyond what is authorized by the state Legislature.	S
✓ SB208 - MIGUEZ	Signed by Gov. - Act 314	No "sanctuary" cities for illegal aliens in Louisiana.	S
✓ SB212 - DUPLESSIS	Bill Failed	Removes requirements for proper immigration documents when applying for a driver's license.	O
✓ SB218 - KLEINPETER	Signed by Gov. - Act 317	Election integrity - prevents ballot harvesting.	S
✓ SB225 - DUPLESSIS	Bill Failed	Pro-abortion measure that creates a right to contraception, including abortifacient drugs and devices, in state law.	O
✓ SB262 - HODGES	Signed by Gov. - Act 326	Forbids schools from teaching that students are either oppressors or oppressed due to their race.	S
✓ SB276 - PRESSLY	Signed by Gov. - Act 246	Abortion By Fraud Criminalization Act - designates abortion drugs as dangerous substances.	S
✓ SB278 - ANDREWS	Signed by Gov.- Act 329	New program to assist women in crisis pregnancies.	S
✓ SB294 - HODGES	Sent to Gov.	Confirms the protections of free speech and First Amendment protected activities on college and university campuses.	S
✓ SB301 - MIGUEZ	Sent to Gov.	Prohibits discrimination in financial transactions involving firearms and ammunition retailers.	S
✓ SB306 - CATHEY	Sent to Gov.	Increases the penalties for sex trafficking of minors.	S
✓ SB312 - EDMONDS	Sent to Gov.	Promotes the website: AdoptionOption.La.Gov.	S
✓ SB313 - EDMONDS	Sent to Gov.	Universal school choice - Educational Savings Accounts.	S
✓ SB325 - EDMONDS	Signed by Gov. - Act 332	When an unborn child is diagnosed with genetic abnormality, the mother must be informed of resources and services available.	S
✓ SB388 - HODGES	Sent to Gov.	Creates the crimes of unlawful entry and unlawful reentry by an illegal alien into Louisiana.	S
✓ SB414 - BASS	Signed by Gov. - Act 398	Removes the requirement that a "safe haven" baby box can only be located in a hospital.	S
✓ SB420 - HODGES	Signed by Gov. - Act 350	Creates the crime of election fraud or forgery.	S
✗ SB486 - SEABAUGH	Bill Failed	No "Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion" in higher education.	S
✓ SCR21 - HODGES	Passed Legis. Gov. Sig. not required	Memorializes Congress to support the nation of Israel in the wake of the October 7, 2023, terror attacks.	S
